Bringing a new puppy into your home can be very exciting for everyone. Consistency among family members is key, 24/7. Have a family meeting, agree on the rules for the puppy, and write them down. This holds everyone accountable.

Saying "no" to your puppy doesn't tell them what you want them to do instead. Say "yes" by rewarding behaviors you like, such as sitting, lying down, and keeping all four paws on the floor instead of jumping. Use part of your pup's meals for rewards instead of feeding their whole daily ration in a bowl.

Remember that pups and dogs "talk" by using their bodies. Learn to read them!
